Christopher Burditt Memorial Scholarship Essay Contest

Christopher Ray Burditt, 40 of Salinas passed away December 31st, 2015. He was born March 28th, 1975 in Salinas. Christopher worked for International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 234 as a Business Representative. He was a member of the Native Sons of California, Salinas Bowmen, Monterey Bay Central Labor Council, Police Activities League, and National Field Archery Association. Christopher Graduated North Monterey County High School in 1993 and received a B.S. Degree from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo in Forestry and Natural Resources with a concentration in Wildlife Biology in 1999.

IBEW Local 234, located in Castroville, represents approximately 600 highly skilled electrical workers. IBEW Local 234 provides Electrical Contractors working throughout Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz County with skilled, knowledgeable Electricians and Apprentices. The IBEW was originally founded in 1891.

IBEW Local 234, in partnership with the Burditt Family, is offering **three (3) \$1,000** scholarships to high school graduates – one each in Monterey, Santa Cruz, and San Benito County, who will graduate during the current school year and who meet all qualifying criteria.

To apply, a student must have at least one present or past union member, **of any affiliation**, in his or her immediate family and type an essay of approximately **500 words** on **one** of the following topics:

- What is the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers and what has it done to enhance organized labor?
- Why is the organized labor movement important in the United States today?
- How has the union movement played a key role in the life and well-being of my family member who **is or was** in a union?
